Numbers 9 and 10 may be inaccessible during the summer. If that is the case, send the separate documents for 9 and 10 as soon as possible before August 25.

9. Please scan in ONE lesson plan typical of those you use to guide your instruction, preferably one connected with the topic you identified in #8b. This plan is not an entire unit, but only represents a significant formative step...typically one to five days of instruction/work time. Send it via Microsoft Word or a PDF attachment that allows copying. *This sample plan is NOT graded.* It only serves as a personal starting point, so you earn credit just by sending it. You may copy the plan t the end of this document or send it in a separate attachment.

If you have a plan from last year in the topic you identified for #8b, please use that plan if it is handy. If not, here are options, starting with the next-best alternative:

- a. Use any lesson plan related to the broader subject (#8a).
- b. If you use personal notes to teach, submit one example. (Messy doesn't matter! ©)
- c. If you use a teacher's textbook or company plans to teach, please submit just one relevant lesson copied from that textbook and scanned as a MSW document.
- d. If you have yet to teach that subject and have no plans, submit a plan you created/used from ANY previous experience. First-year teachers may use a college plan.
- 10. Please scan in ONE copy of an assessment tool you used in the past, preferably connected with the topic you identified in #8b, and preferably the <u>summative tool for the related unit</u> used by you and your students. This tool may be copied from a text or online source; the point is to study what you currently use to assess student work in connection with the 8b topic.

Options if you do not have a summative assessment tool or list of expectation/critieria related to the topic for #8b:

- a. Choose a formative assessment tool for that unit used by both you and your students.
- b. If students did not use this assessment tool, use what guided your own assessment of whether students achieve the learning objectives. For example, you may send a rubric you used from your teacher's text, a checklist, or just list your memorized criteria on a document.

 c. If the tool does not directly relate to 8b, just send one related to the subject (8a).
